Exploring the role of children's use of in-between spaces within school environments in Australia in children's development of their sense of agency

Project summary

This study aims to explore the potential role of children's use of the informal environments of schools (the in-between spaces) in children's development of their sense of agency. The aim is to identify the nature of these physical settings and their role in children's preferred activities, to better understand their potential value to both staff and students within the context of students' schooling. The proposed study is a multisite qualitative case study to be completed with children, aged between 8 and 10 years (grades 3-5), in three schools in Sydney. Fieldwork in each school would be carried out over a four week period. In that time behaviour mapping of children's play around the school would be conducted during the recess and lunch time periods over the four weeks. In parallel with this process, 20 walking interviews around the school grounds and up to 6 focus groups (of 2-3 students) would be completed during the same four weeks. A summary of the findings from the study will be provided to the schools. These will offer insight into children's motivations for using the informal environments of their schools and assist in identifying the key characteristics for the success of those environments in children's lives. The benefit for students and staff will lie in a greater understanding of the value of these informal spaces in children's school lives and learning outcomes. This could be used to advocate for their importance in school environment designs of the future. This research project will begin in Term 4 and permission notes will be sent home to students in Yrs 3-5 in Week 1. We are very excited to be involved in this project, and look forward to the outcome.

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
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
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
