FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE

ICAS Mathematics Results

In Term 3, 196 students in Years 4-6 sat for the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) Mathematics assessment. The results are:

50 students received High Distinctions;

50 students received Distinction;

29 students received Credit;

13 students received Merit: and

54 students received Participation.

Well done SHPS on an impressive result.

UNESCO Study Visit

On Tuesday 11 October, Summer Hill PS hosted 10 delegates from UNESCO to assist them in understanding how our school uses data to inform planning and programming. Representatives from Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, New Zealand, Pakistan, the Philippines and Singapore took part in the visit. The UNESCO International Institute for Educational Planning (IIEP) decided to organise - in partnership with the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) - a study visit to Australia, in opportunity for other countries of the order to provide the Asia-Pacific region to learn from the My School experience useful lessons for improving transparency and accountability through public access to school data. The study visit familiarised a select number of decision makers and high-level education officials with this innovative programme permitting them to learn from that experience, and provide substance for reflection and comparison with the situations prevailing in their own countries.



How to Stop Cyberbullying in its Tracks

Around 463,000 young people in Australia are bullied online each year, with victims suffering a profound loss of self-esteem, depression, anxiety and, in some cases, engaging in self-harm and suicide. Now, a powerful new online tool aims to change all that by targeting bullying behaviour before it starts. Called reword, it's a Google Chrome download that works in real time to identify cruel and threatening language and prompts users to reword their post or message by putting a red line through insulting words and phrases. It's a "moment's pause to remember the person on the other end", says Monica Lewin, Group Account Director and Strategic Planner at Leo Burnett Melbourne, the company behind the 'social media etiquette' tool.

And it seems to work, if the numbers are any indication. Since launching in May, users over a six-week period showed a willingness to reword 87% of the time, up 8% from the pilot study. There was also a 67% reduction in online bullying - a decrease in the number of times the red line appeared over time. So far, more than half a million people have downloaded the software and its creators are now working on an iOS app. As well as Facebook and Twitter, the software works across a range of messaging platforms wherever there is a text field. This includes social media sites, email, YouTube comments section and the review sections on sites like Amazon. It's the first software of its kind in Australia and only the second in the world. The other is an iOS app called ReThink, developed by 13-year-old Chicago student, Trisha Prabhu, as part of a science project. That app has a pop-up interface, with an early study showing a 93% willingness to reword.

Students in the pilot program at Yarraville West Primary School in Victoria described it as being "a game-changer", "like autocorrect", and something to "make your conscience kick in and tell you not to."

Student Parliament

2017 will see the implementation of Summer Hill Public School Student Parliament. The School Parliament model is seen as a means of empowering students through active involvement in a fully functioning democratic model.

Students from Year 2-5 are involved in the election of the School Parliament and the outcomes are listed below:

- Students will become actively involved in decision making processes within the school community.
- Students gain an appreciation of the benefits of a democratic society.
- Students will learn to act on their beliefs in a socially responsible manner.
- Students will be able to identify, express and act upon his/her concerns.
- Students will respect the differing attitudes and values of others.
- Students will realise that the giving of one's service to one's fellow pupils, teachers and the school in general, results in a better school community.
- Students will experience the democratic process first-hand.
- Students will have an awareness of the structure/role of Government and Parliamentary procedures.
- Parliamentary decisions will be seen to have an influence on school activities.
- Members of Parliament will exhibit strong leadership skills.
- Ministers of Parliament will provide an exemplary role model for all students.
- Members of Parliament will realise that through the democratic process each person has the right to free expression of ideas, together with responsibility for the well being of all.

Students in Year 5 are currently working with their teachers to work through the election process and the roles and responsibilities involved in the School Parliament they can nominate for. Nominations will be called for in Week 2 of Term 4, 2016. Parents with a child in Year 5 may want to have a discussion with them pertaining to the attributes of a good leader. A comprehensive Policy will be published to the wider school community in the very near future.

China Music Tour

Our Music tour to China was an amazing experience and I was so very proud of the students who participated, not only for the quality of their performances, but for their behaviour and responsible attitude to the demands that were placed on them to be on time and organised.

The following is an overview of the tour: After arriving in Shanghai we had city sight-seeing in the morning: Pudong New District & Lujiazui Financial Zone; then visited Yu Garden & Nanjing Road, Shanghai premier shopping area for souvenirs. We visited the Bund, the historic riverfront district in the afternoon, where the Gothic, Neo-Classical, and Art Deco buildings housed the European banks and trading houses that dominated Shanghai early in the 20th Century. We then had a Pujiang River Cruiser after dinner. The following day was at Disney Shanghai Resort for fun and relaxation. The following morning, coach transfer to City of Yangzhou, another famous ancient city with more than thousand years of history. The city also known as 'Canal City' is the origin of famous 'Huai-Yang Style Cuisine'. Next a visit to the 'Ge Garden', Dongguan Shopping Street, then a visit to Slender West Lake, famous for its scenic splendour. The lake is typical of the Chinese water-based garden art combining the grace and elegance of the south with the grandeur and magnificence of the north. That night we enjoyed a traditional Yang-Style Cuisine for dinner. On day 5 we went by coach transfer to Nanjing in the morning, visited Nanjing Museum, the second largest museum in China; Our students participated in a performance with students from schools in China this day. The following day we went to the Nanjing Hongshan Forest Zoo in the morning, where we saw Chinese indigenous animals including the Giant Panda. That afternoon we caught the bullet train to Zhengzhou City, the capital city of Henan Province, the most largely populated state in the middle of China. Day 7 included City sight-seeing for local attractions followed by an exchange music performance in the afternoon, then on to Dengfeng after dinner. At our visit to a Shaolin Temple - the birthplace of shaolin kungfu and Zen Buddhisim, we enjoyed the Kungfu show, visited a temple and the pagoda forest. This was a deep experience in pure Chinese martial arts and Buddhism. We then transferred to Zhengzhou Railway Station after lunch, and caught the bullet train to Beijing. Days 9-10 were spent in Beijing where we visited Tian An Men Square, the Temple of Heaven and The Great Wall. We finished our tour with souvenir shopping before flying home to Sydney.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Ms Donna Ross, Mrs Rebecca Salter, Mrs Quinnie Young and Ms Cathy Chan for their support of our students during the tour. They were a great team and were on duty 24 hours a day ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our students.


Events included the biscuit race, the balloon popping race and the very popular water balloon throwing challenge. A great day was had by all.

"We are in the midst of a culture war. And vulnerable children are being used as cannon fodder.

"It's changing school language, changing bathrooms — it's changing the whole school environment." - Daily Telegraph.

"Safe schools can save lives. Well, it could have saved lives if it wasn't gutted by the Turnbull Government." – The Project.

In 2014 the Abbott government committed a small amount of federal funding to an anti-bullying program known as "Safe Schools." In 2016, the funding was scrapped, the program was investigated and a political storm brewed.
