Canterbury Boys High School -Partners in Learning with Sydney University

Canterbury Boys' High School was one of thirteen schools across all school systems to be selected for the Sydney University STEM Academy. Canterbury Boys were selected for its academic achievements in science, technology, engineering and maths.

In October and November this year, Year 5 and 6 students at Summer Hill Public were taught by teachers from Canterbury Boys in the area of STEM. Over four weeks students participated in science and robotics workshops. Year 6 engaged in experiments surrounding light including dispersion, refraction and optical illusions. Year 5 engaged in the design process to build and program robots to perform every day and more complex tasks. We thoroughly enjoyed the program and are thrilled to be extending this into a semester based STEM program at Canterbury Boys in 2017.

Quality Numeracy Kindergarten - Year 2

They are to be commended for completing 20 hours of modules after school for over a term. This information will be shared amongst all staff and implemented into classroom programs.



NAPLAN Online advice

NSW schools have been advised by the school sectors that paper-based delivery of NAPLAN tests will continue in 2017, with timelines for transition to online delivery to be communicated early next year. This follows agreement by the Education Ministers that NAPLAN will transition to online delivery over a three-year period from 2017.

Parents wanting to know more can review ACARA's transition research and development program and other key national information about NAPLAN Online, including frequently asked questions.

A public demonstration site of the online assessment platform is available to schools, students and the community via the ACARA website. It contains sample questions covering all test domains and NAPLAN year levels. It provides an opportunity for students to become familiar with the question types and format of the online tests and schools to assess the technical requirements for delivering NAPLAN Online. TEACHING kids about money

Teaching kids about money can be a chore but many children have their first money experience by doing simple jobs around the home. New research from financial comparison website finder.com.au shows about two in six children earn money for washing the dishes or doing their homework, while one in six get paid for cleaning the house.

But surprisingly, about 43 per cent of children don't do anything to receive pocket money.

The site's spokeswoman, Bessie Hassan, says children learn a lot about money from an early age and "pocket money is a terrific way to teach kids how to value money".

The Teacher's Mutual Bank 50 Years of Pocket Money report, released on Monday 21 November, 2016 found almost 70 per cent of people received pocket money as a child, and about two in three say their allowance was dependent on them doing household chores. Teachers' Mutual Bank chief executive officer Steve James says handing out pocket money is a great way for children to develop a foundation for becoming "money smart."

"The survey showed almost 66 per cent of respondents say children should be looking after things like pets or doing the laundry, mowing or gardening or doing household jobs around the kitchen," he says.

"The survey showed anywhere between \$5 and \$20 is the (weekly) amount to be given."

Schools Spectacular

The performance was held at Qudos Bank Arena Sydney Olympic Park last Friday and Saturday with just over 5000 performers making it the largest Schools Spectacular to date. We are now in the Guiness Book of World Records.


Suitcase Stories – Tangled Lives
