## **FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE**

### **ENROLMENTS NOW BEING TAKEN FOR 2017**

### **Semester I Reports**

This term reports are being sent home for each student at the end of Week 10. Each year we have had to refine our reports to suit not only changes in curriculum, but also acting on feedback from staff and parents. Our reports must adhere to departmental guidelines in many respects. One of the main focuses for our staff is to ensure consistency with our assessing and reporting. Our teachers have spent many sessions working together to analyse student work samples and evaluating the levels of achievement. Students are tracked on syllabus outcomes in order to identify where each child sits at this point in time for their grade expectations. These identify what the expected outcomes are for students by the end of this semester. Teachers can then determine the level of achievement for every student.

### **OVERALL LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT**

### Kindergarten reports:

With our Kindergarten reports, students will receive an effort grading, except for Library. This effort grade reflects the commitment that each child displays towards their learning. Effort reflects how well a student has tried, the persistence and determination to achieve at the best level of which they are capable.

### Year I - Year 6 reports:

The Department of Education mandates that all student reports for grades I-6 are to use a standard achievement rating scale. Below is our interpretation and how we will report to our families:

### **Outstanding Achievement**

For a student to attain Outstanding they would have an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and readily be able to apply this to other areas. They would be working on an individualised or adjusted learning program and be achieving well beyond stage level (ie if in Year 2 they would be working at and achieving at Year 4 or higher).

#### High Achievement

For a student to attain High they would have a thorough knowledge and understanding of content. The student would be working at and achieving above grade level (ie if in Year 2 they would be working at and achieving at Year 3 level).

### **Sound Achievement**

Students achieving Sound are working at achieving at their appropriate grade level (ie if in Year 2 they are working at and achieving at Year 2 level). It is the expected level of achievement according to the child's grade.

#### **Basic Achievement**

For a student to receive Basic they would have a basic knowledge of the content and be working at and achieving below grade level. (ie if in Year 2 they would be working at and achieving at Year I level).

#### **Limited Achievement**

For a student to receive Limited they would have a very limited knowledge of content covered and be working at and achieving well below grade level, even at an earlier stage (ie if in Year 4 they would be working at and achieving at Year 2 or lower).

Parents should note that a Sound grade is a good grade! It means that your child is working where they should be at this point in time.

### **EFFORT**

All students will also receive an effort rating for each subject area. Effort reflects how well a student has tried, the persistence and determination to achieve at the best level of which they are capable.

### **Learning Intentions/ Goals**

As well as identifying student achievements in their reports, we have added Learning Goals or Learning Intentions for both English and Mathematics. This will be to identify those areas of focus in Semester 2 for each student.

I trust that this has provided you with some explanation of what to expect when sharing reports with your children. Any parents wishing for further clarification are most welcome to contact their teacher.

### New Leadership Program - Student Parliament Parent Information Session

The implementation of Student Parliament is seen as a means of empowering students through active involvement in a fully functioning democratic model.

Outcomes:

- Members of Parliament will exhibit strong leadership skills.
- Ministers of Parliament will provide an exemplary role model for all students.
- Students will experience the democratic process at first hand.
- Students will have an awareness of the structure/role of Government and Parliamentary procedures.
- Parliamentary decisions will be seen to have an influence on school activities.
- Members of Parliament will realise that through the democratic process each person has the right to free expression of ideas, together with responsibility for the well-being of all.

There will be a Student Parliament parent information session on *Tuesday 21 June at 6pm in the Library* prior to the P&C meeting. This session will provide parents, especially parents of Year 5 students, with an understanding of the new leadership program that will be introduced into Summer Hill PS this year. Staff and students in Year 5 have been given an overview of the roles and responsibilities of parliamentarians and the process for nomination and voting. You are welcome to come along and find out what will be required of students who will nominate for Student Parliament for 2017 and the following years.

### **Debating Success**

Two teams of Year 6 debaters have had their first debates in the Premier's Debating Competition. Last week Jeanette, Saskia, Emily and Erica debated against Fort Street Primary School. The topic was:" That schools should teach more Maths and Science instead of Art and Music". Summer Hill was the affirmative team and won the debate.

On Monday 6 June, William, Jack, Thomas and Ludwig debated against Ashfield Public School. The topic was: "That we should only have eight weeks of school holidays each year". Summer Hill was the affirmative team and won. On Wednesday 8 June, our two debating teams debated against Leichhardt PS. Both teams were successful. A pleasing result for a group of children who are novice debaters but have worked very hard. Congratulations to our student debaters and to their coach, Mrs Glenda Bell!

### **Chess Champions**

Fifteen of our talented chess players attended an important Inner West tournament at Holy Innocents Primary School in Croydon on Friday 10 June. As a team, Summer Hill won the day, soundly outscoring several other schools with strong teams. While Jay C (6BN) scored 4th as an individual and Kevin Z (6TK) scored 1st, I was proud of how all of our players showed great sportsmanship and demonstrated respect, responsibility and resilience throughout the day. Because of this victory, SHPS chess will move to the semi-finals later this year.

### **Completion of Community Grant for Playground Upgrade**

Through the NSW Community Building Partnership (CBP) Program, Jo Haylen Member for Summer Hill, invested \$200,000 in local projects in our community. This funding aimed to help local community groups improve their buildings, facilities and services as well as support for local jobs.

Summer Hill PS was one of the very fortunate recipients of this funding, receiving \$28,849 to be used to upgrade the soft fall surfaces around the school, and complete a number of other works which aimed to increase the use of the available play space in the K-2 and Yrs 3-6 playground areas. Jo Haylen will be attending our Summer Hill Blues Assembly on Friday I July to officially celebrate the completion of the funded playground works. We are very grateful to the P&C for their involvement in the submission and for overseeing of this project. Our students are reaping the benefit of a much safer and better functioning playground.

### Canterbury Boys High School Year 5 Invitation - Inspire, Innovate and Create

Boys in Year 5 are invited to participate in a STEAM Enrichment Program in conjunction with Canterbury BHS and the University of Wollongong. The aim of the program is to explore careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM). The 2 day program will be held on Monday 25 July and Tuesday 26 July, 2016. Expressions of Interest will be provided to interested students or may be collected from the Office. These forms are to be completed and returned to school by Monday 27 June. There is no cost to participate in this program, however parents are responsible for dropping off and picking up their child.

### **Harmony Day Poster Competition**

Congratulations to Erica P of 6TK who was awarded Highly Commended in this year's competition! More than 3500 entries were received from schools across New South Wales followed by an awards presentation at NSW Parliament House earlier this month.

# YEAR 5 OUTDOOR LEARNING GREAT AUSSIE CAMP KINCUMBER 2016

Outdoor learning opportunities provide children with tremendous learning experiences that go beyond the value that is gained from the activities themselves. Research has identified that well-structured outdoor education programs offer learners the opportunities to develop their knowledge and skills in ways that add value to their everyday experiences in the classroom.

Alongside the skills and knowledge gained, outdoor learning can enhance interpersonal relationships, improve self-esteem and self-efficacy, improve socialisation skills and facilitate group bonding and co-operation These opportunities also reduce the formality of the relationships between students and staff and allow for the development of closer relationships that can transfer with positive results into the classroom.

A significant benefit gained from outdoor camp experiences is the level of self-responsibility that is fostered. At various times during the course of a camp, students need to manage their own property and organisation for different activities. Communal living arrangements require them to gain a better understanding of how their organisation and habits impact on the lives of others. They need to respect other people's space, property and need for sleep. They may need to negotiate to achieve a harmonious outcome.

If you ask the students about the reason for outdoor education experiences they'll provide a much simpler answer – it's just great fun!

The program on the Year Five Camp held at the Great Aussie Bush Camp in Kincumber has been specially designed and honed to stimulate the students, to equip them with new skills and to take them far enough out of their comfort zones to be enriching, but not so far as to be counterproductive!

I offer my sincere thanks to the teachers who attended the Year 5 camp - Ms Phillips, Mrs Bell, Mrs Winters, Mr Monk and Ms Carroll. This takes them beyond the call of duty in many ways, but they do it willingly because they know the benefits it brings to the students.

We had a great time on camp! The students were great ambassadors for the school and their families. They challenged themselves and reaped the rewards. They displayed a strong spirit of adventure; a willingness to explore and to try new things, some of which took them way out of their comfort zone! Well done Year 5!


### **FEDERAL ELECTION DAY BBQ 2016**




## Triple P Seminar in Ashfield
