Congratulations to Flora Year 1, Kimaya Year 2, Frank Year 3 and Austin Year 5. Prizes were presented at the Marrickville Library Pavilion on Thursday 12 September. Kimaya's mum told us she was so happy and excited to get another book to read. A big thanks to our teacher librarian Ms Grimmett for instilling the love of reading in our kids. Noami in Year 4 and Lloyd in Year 3 have been successful in obtaining a place in the afternoon session of the 2019 Primary Drama Workshops with Australian Theatre for Young People.

In celebrating our school and public education here is a story that makes me proud. Last Friday casual teacher Mr Rea taught the first day of his teaching career in Ms Donato's kindergarten classroom. This is the same classroom he started his first day of school in, when he was in kindy at Sumer Hill Public School. Wow!







You may have heard or read about the Departments' revised enrolment policy to be implemented as of Term 4 2019 (next term). This policy will be used to update our school enrolment procedures ready for the 2020 school year. The implications of this policy for our school will be minimal and will not impact students residing in the local catchment area at the time of enrolment. All local students are entitled to enrol at Summer Hill Public School.

NAPLAN Premiers' priority is a measure of the number of students in the Top 2 bands in NAPLAN Reading and Numeracy. Our 2019 average percentage of students in the top 2 bands is 63,78% (Mainstream Enrolment). 80.58% of Year 3 students performed in the top two bands for NAPLAN Reading! Amazing!



In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensi behaviour has no place in our school communities.


