The Golden Garbage Bin Award for 2022

Paper Lunch Bag Recycling - The EZEC Waste Reduction Project

For the past two terms, 5 Kelp have been investigating and researching how Summer Hill PS can reduce our waste going to landfill. At the start of term 2 we conducted an initial waste audit to see what was being thrown away and what areas we could improve. We noticed a lot of things being thrown away that could actually be recycled or should not be in the bin in the first place.

18.2% of the waste going to landfill was actually paper or cardboard that could be recycled. This was the second largest contribution to landfill after food organic waste (making up 25.2% of SHPS's landfill waste). This statistic shocked us so Jasmina, Frankie, Aisha and Calia created a plan to reduce the amount of paper going to landfill and improve our already existing system.

The girls decided a separate bin for paper recycling that has a blue lid should be placed on the playground in eating areas for both K-2 and 3-6 so students have a way to recycle their clean paper at lunch and recess. Posters with the same information will also be put up in every space that has paper recycling. This will help us care for our school, Country and become more sustainably active citizens of Summer Hill.

We also want to encourage all of summer Hill citizens to use paper and cardboard recycling more effectively and efficiently so that it is not really waste. Some of the items that can go in the paper recycling include paper drawings, ripped paper, scrap paper, clean lunch order bags (not covered in food and empty of forks), cardboard, empty cardboard boxes, newspapers, magazines.


Some of the items that DO NOT go in the paper recycling bins include food covered lunch order bags, greasy cardboard boxes, coffee cups and lids, milk and juice cartons, soup and noodle containers, Ice block tubes, wooden cutlery, plastic wrappers, food, lunchboxes and toys, drink cans, tissues, paper towel, wet wipes. These items will all go in the landfill bins or can be taken home to be sorted into mixed recycling or compost!

Some tips to remember to make this system work:

- If it looks like paper and rips like paper, blue bin it.
- If its paper and its clean, blue bin it.
- If you have drawn on both sides, blue bin it.
- If it has some germs (tissues or paper towel) throw it in landfill.
- If you are unsure where it goes, ask a buddy.
- If you are still unsure, put it in landfill so the blue bins don't get contaminated.



For the final week of term, students have been working on a 'Create a Country' project where they are able to use the information we have learned about the way countries function to create their own country.


Here is a comment from Jessica Summer in 5 Marlin about the project:
