




#### 5 Wasabi Picture Books

The trickiest part has been creating imagery that follows the structure of 'Show, Don't Tell'. We have learnt all about characterisation and the effective use of speech, thoughts, actions, effect on others and character profiles. We can't wait to take our picture books home for Christmas!

Our library refit is almost complete and in 2024 the library has big things instore. Thank you to all our parents and friends who have supported updating our classroom reading collections. It is fabulous to see students making connections to the new titles that cater to both fiction and non-fiction readers. The Premier's Reading Challenge Certificates have arrived! Well done to the 482 students who participated this year. When a student has completed the challenge four years in a row, they receive a Gold Certificate. Students are awarded a Platinum Certificate when they have participated in the challenge for seven years. This year we received 4 Platinum and 17 Gold Certificates from the Premier. These awards were presented to students at our presentation day ceremony.

Unfortunately, our library is closed for student loaning. We are keen to review our collections and replace any lost or damaged books. To support us in this process, please check your child's book/s have/has been safely returned to school. Students don't need to wait until their library day to return books, they can stop by the library in the morning or when the library is open at recess.
