Science and Robokids

Our Stage 1 students recently delved into the world of robotics with enthusiasm and creativity through the engaging Robokids program. Over several sessions, young minds explored the fundamentals of coding and robotics, building their own robots and programming them to perform various tasks. Students have been utilising this knowledge to create their very own Rube Goldberg inspired machines during in class science lessons. Students were tasked to design and create a machine from re-cycled materials. They had to explain which forces would help their machine move and operate, putting their problem-solving skills to the test.

Stage 1 students recently enjoyed a memorable experience with Musica Viva, an enriching incursion that brought music to life right here at school. Guided by talented musicians, our young learners immersed themselves in melodies, rhythms, and interactive musical activities. Prior to the day, students had created rain sticks during music lessons with Mrs Biffin to enhance their involvement and appreciation of music. 


4 Handball




4 Handball




